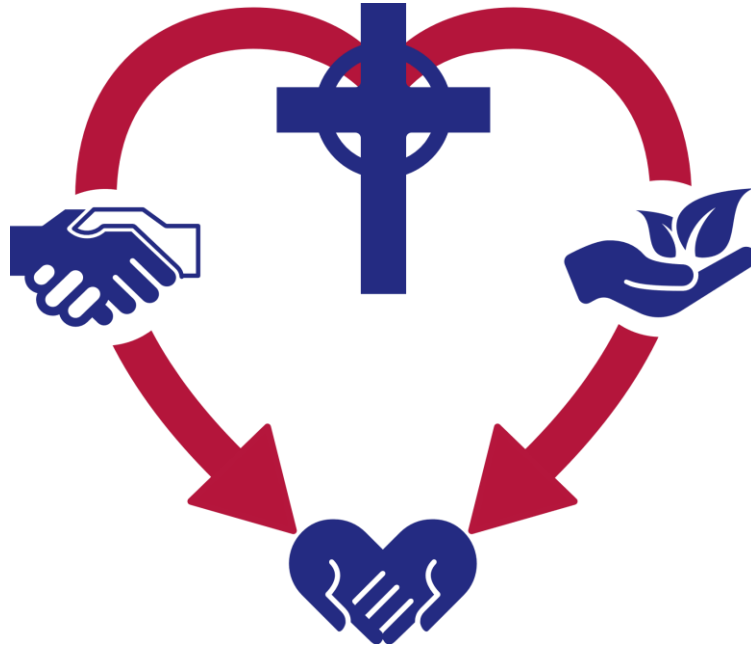
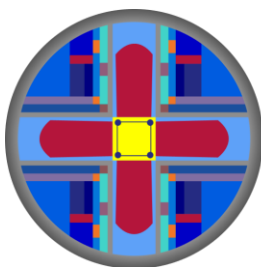

Prayer of Confession (Unison)

Lord of lords and Master of all, you have stooped down to us to live among us as a servant, and you've humbled yourself to wash the feet of your lowly disciples. By your great humility, you call us to humble ourselves, acknowledge our pride and vain desires, and serve others as you have served us. Forgive us for looking down on others, for disregarding people whose work seems menial, and for using even our own good works as a source of that pride and vainglory. Give us hearts like Jesus, so that we may use our positions and privilege to help abolish systems of abuse, oppression, and injustice, and live for your Kingdom and your glory alone, rather than our own. Following him with fear and trembling, may we love you and our neighbors through self-sacrifice and self-emptying service. So, wash our feet, living God, even as you cleanse and renew our souls, that we may truly serve you in one another.

**Heidelberg Catechism, Lord's Day 1**

**Leader: What is your only comfort, in life and in death?**

**People: That I belong—body and soul, in life and in death—not to myself, but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ, who at the cost of his own blood, has fully paid for all my sins, and has completely freed me from the dominion of the devil; that he protects me so well that, without the will of my Father in heaven, not even a hair can fall from my head; indeed, that everything must fit his purpose for my salvation. And because I belong to him, Christ, by the Holy Spirit, assures me of eternal life, and makes me wholeheartedly willing and ready from now on to live for him.**

**Leader: What must you know to live and die in the joy of this comfort?**

**People: Three things: first, the greatness of my sin and misery; second, how I am set free from all my sins and misery; and third, how I should thank God for such deliverance.**
